The Loft Estates are located in the area between Sunrise Highway and Merrick Road west of Grand Avenue in Baldwin. In this section of Baldwin, there are no businesses located on Sunrise Highway. The side and rear yards of the residences line directly up to Sunrise Highway.

Members of The Baldwin Civic Association complained to the First Precinct about large tractor trailers parking on Sunrise Highway and disobeying posted signs, especially over the weekend. Current signs limit parking in that area of Baldwin to two hours. The complainants explained that the tractor trailers were often parked on Friday nights and they were not removed until early on Monday morning, which would wake homeowners and expose them to the exhaust from the trucks. Officers from the First Precinct POP office began to monitor the situation and brought it to the attention of the Post Cars and the precinct's parking enforcement agents. Marked and unmarked units began to intensify patrol around this section of Baldwin – especially by Derby Court.

Officers spoke with the occupants of the cars and tractor trailers parked on Sunrise Highway and explained the parking restrictions, as well as the complaints and concerns from the people living in the area. These warnings were given prior to the vehicles being parked overtime in an attempt to solve the problem quickly. When autos were found to be in violation of the posted signs, parking summonses were issued.

Members from the POP office stayed in contact with the original complainant. They were told to call the First Precinct desk to report any parking conditions. As the weeks progressed, fewer autos were seen parking in this area. At the most recent Baldwin Civic Association meeting, a member thanked the First Precinct POP office for solving this problem.

Second Precinct POP (North) Success Story

Commercial burglaries have been on an uptick in the precinct in 2017. Numerous small businesses have been targeted by thieves, many of which included oriental food establishments, nail salons, auto dealerships and bakeries. In most of these incidents, the proceeds were small – usually cash from the registers, tip jars, and food supplies. The auto dealerships were being targeted for tires and rims.

After many discussions between the commanding officer, the squad, the crime analysts and the POP officers, it was decided that the POP officers would be sent out to visit the targeted businesses. A form letter containing possible strategies for each type of establishment was created to help the businesses avoid being the victims of a burglary. For instance, all of the businesses were advised to install or update their burglar alarms and door locks and to add additional lighting, and cameras and fencing, where appropriate. Places that dealt with cash were urged not to leave cash in the registers overnight. If possible, they were told to leave the drawers open and a sign on the door stating that there was no cash in the store. The car dealerships were advised to park their vehicles in a manner which made it harder to remove the wheels and also made it easier for patrols to see if anything was missing.

Commercial burglaries started to decrease and a major arrest helped to bring the numbers down precinct-wide. Similar strategies are planned to address other crime patterns.





Second Precinct POP (South) Success Story

The Second Precinct South POP officers, along with the Motor Carrier Section of the Highway Patrol Division, were tasked with enforcing the weight restriction and speeding violations of tractor trailer vehicles and other large commercial vehicles in the Old Bethpage area.

The Police Department had received multiple complaints by area residents that large trucks had been violating the weight restriction and speed limit on Round Swamp and Old Bethpage Roads.

During the observation and investigation stage, the POP unit noticed that many of the weight restriction signs were partially covered by brush. The Town of Oyster Bay Highway Department was contacted to remove the brush. The town responded swiftly and cut away the brush blocking the signs that were placed by the town. Soon thereafter, the supervisor in charge contacted the POP Unit and advised that some of the signs in question were placed by the county. The supervisor stated that he would get his crew to cut back some of the brush in front of these signs since his crew was in the area already.

The POP Unit created an informational letter for all of the local businesses that utilize large commercial vehicles advising them of the weight restrictions on these roads and how to avoid these roads unless they are being used for local delivery. These letters were hand delivered to these businesses.

The clearing of the weight restriction signs and the issuance of the informational letter, along with the multiple summonses issued after the informational period, has limited the number of large commercial trucks in the area.

Regarding the speeding issue, POP and the post cars have issued multiple summonses on Round Swamp and Old Bethpage Roads, to not only commercial trucks but to passenger vehicles as well.

The complaints have subsided due to the above actions of the POP Unit, Highway Department, Post Cars and the Town of Oyster Bay.

On 09/19/2017, POP Police Officers Hedgecock and Krukowski attended the Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Workshop for Law Enforcement's "Train the Trainer Program," hosted and sponsored by DOH, NYS Dept. of Highways and Engineers, NHTSA and the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee. After completing the program, officers approached the Village of Great Neck to institute this new enforcement initiative.

After several meetings between the village and the Department of Public Works, six "non-signalized" crossings were identified for upgrade to high-visibility crossings. These high-visibility crossings received numerous additional two-way crossing signage and pre-crossing signage to highlight the area. Of the six crossings updated, one was identified as the enforcement target area due to the crossing volume and pedestrian cross-section during school hours. These crossings were found to be used by Great Neck High School aged pedestrians to cross back and forth during their lunch periods from school in the vicinity of 540 Middle Neck Road, a mid-block crossing.

Pedestrian Safety Blitzes were conducted, which utilized a "Progressive Ticketing method." It's a three-stage process based on education, warning and ticketing. These blitzes were held on 9/28/2017, 10/26/2017, 11/29/2017 and 12/7/2017. A total of 33 written warnings and 45 summonses were issued.

On 11/15/2017, a meeting between the village attorneys, staff and the POP Officers was conducted – to review the Pedestrian Crossing Vehicle and Traffic Law (1151A FAILED TO YLD RT-OF-WAY TO PEDESTRIAN/CROSSWALK).

Prosecution strategies, testimonies and official exhibits were discussed prior to any summons activity was returned to the court.

This model of implementation for this enforcement initiative is now being discussed with several other villages who have requested to become involved and have a heavy pedestrian occupation.





THIRD PRECINCT (SOUTH) POP SUCCESS STORY

The Third Precinct historically has had very limited and sporadic graffiti cases. However, over the summer of 2017, and into the start of the new school year, the precinct received increased reports of graffiti popping up on fences, traffic signs, light posts, mail boxes, construction equipment, and porta-potties, as well as on store fronts and school grounds. Some areas were hit multiple times at great expense to some homeowners causing outrage and complaints. The Town of North Hempstead Code Enforcement, while effective in finding and pointing out graffiti, was becoming the focus of outrage from residents who felt victimized twice – once from the graffiti itself and twice after receiving a fine for not removing the graffiti in a timely manner. Civic Groups and even the Town of North Hempstead supervisor were among those receiving complaints asking POP for a solution.

POP officers photographed and compared the graffiti and found two different types or tags. The most common tag "SARE" or "SARE4" was made in many different colors and styles, such as bubble letter and lines. The other less frequent tag, "SEHS" or "SEHSER," was mostly bubble letters on fences and commercial real estate. POP officers placed the known graffiti locations on a map and noticed a greater frequency of occurrences were centrally located around the vicinity of Herrick's High School.

POP officers spent time combing through the neighborhoods searching for more graffiti victims and photographing and taking statements to help build a case in the hopes of finding possible video surveillance or witnesses. POP encouraged victims to remove the graffiti as soon as possible. Quick removal of graffiti often discourages repeat offenses as it is the type of crime based on visual recognition. POP explained to the victims that graffiti often attracts more competing graffiti if it is not removed. It was determined that the graffiti was most likely done overnight and not during the day. POP, along with the assistance of Town of North Hempstead Code Enforcement was able to obtain new locations of graffiti. Code enforcement was also able to provide photo evidence of these locations with approximate dates and times of each occurrence. As a result of the search, much of the SARE graffiti was found to be centered on the Herrick's High School so a meeting was set up between POP officers and Herrick's High School leadership. The assistant principal pledged to assist POP officers by distributing pictures of the graffiti to the school staff and elected student bodies. POP officers, Deputy Inspector Abruzzo and members from the Electronics Squad discussed the placement of a camera in a high frequency location. POP was able to collaborate with a

graffiti victim whose PVC fence was hit on three separate occurrences. An area was established and a good location to place a deer camera was found. The Electronics Squad installed the camera soon after the owner cleaned the fence.

The assistant principal called POP within a few weeks of their meeting and stated that he had found the graffiti artist. POP officers responded with Third Precinct Detective Ferrer. The student's notes and papers were found with "SARE" and "SARE4" graffiti written throughout. The student and his parents were fully cooperative and officers Cooper and Atkin, along with Detective Ferrer drove the subject to each graffiti location to document a full confession. As expected, after interviewing the subject further, it was determined that he was not responsible for the "SEHS" tags. More work was done in the field and POP Officer Cooper recovered video surveillance showing a suspicious vehicle and a subject spraying SEHS. The subject and plate info on the vehicle was unclear; however Police Officer Atkin and Detective Ferrer were able to determine the make and approximate year of the vehicle, as well as the approximate age, race and gender of the subject. What made this vehicle unique was the location of the license plate. The front license plate was mounted to the passenger side of the front bumper, making it stand out. POP assisted the Third Precinct Intel Analysts complete a precinct-wide bulletin, featuring a map of the precinct with graffiti indicators and a picture of the front of the subject vehicle with the off-center license plate. Detective Ferrer, using data from traffic cameras and some old fashioned detective work, effectively linked the vehicle with the second graffiti artist and secured a confession and an arrest for the SEHS tags.

Both subjects were arrested and charged with multiple counts of criminal mischief. It appeared as though the subjects didn't know each other. Over 50 cases have been closed out and new graffiti has not appeared. The deer camera was recovered by the Electronics Squad and yielded negative results. The civic groups involved state they will work with the Town of North Hempstead to determine if the town can offer to help residents with the removal any future graffiti, as opposed to penalizing residents with fines. POP will continue to work with schools, residents and local governments to help prevent graffiti and maintain the quality for life for the residents of the Third Precinct.

FOURTH PRECINCT POP SUCCESS STORY

Fourth Precinct POP Officers O'Neill and Zanni received several complaints from residents and commercial business owners regarding unregistered autos parked on Sagamore Road in North Long Beach.

In the past, Officers O'Neill and Zanni successfully managed parking issues on Industrial Road, which runs perpendicular to Sagamore Road. Unregistered autos at this location have been a chronic problem. Many commercial auto-body shops are located in the area and have used several streets in the area to "dump" or park autos that they own or that need work.

The Fourth Precinct POP Officers responded to the area and observed several unregistered/ uninspected automobiles parked on Sagamore Rd. The officers took the time to speak with the neighboring auto body shops to locate the owners of the cars/trucks and requested that any autos that lack license plates to be removed from the street.

The POP team continued to visually monitor the area over the next couple of weeks. The neighboring auto body shops had complied and removed all of the unregistered autos. POP also worked with the Post Cars to make sure that they were aware of this ongoing issue.

In December, the POP officers returned to Sagamore Road during the early evening hours to find several unregistered autos parked on the street. Multiple tickets were issued. While the POP officers were issuing the appropriate tickets, the auto-body business owner who owned the autos (located on Sagamore Road) was present. Upon issuing numerous parking violations, the owner complied by following police direction and removed the autos to a secure lot.

The Fourth Precinct POP officers, with the help of the Precinct Post Car have successfully alleviated the parking issues in the area. The situation will be monitored on a regular basis.

SEVENTH PRECINCT POP SUCCESS STORY

Seventh Precinct POP officers were contacted by a Massapequa resident reporting narcotics activity at a neighbors' house. Only an address was provided. POP officers were able to identify names associated with the address, and from there, did some investigative work to link several names and vehicles related to the residents showing possible narcotic networks. POP was also in contact with the town to investigate any possible past issues at the location regarding ownership and if in fact the house was in foreclosure, which was reported by complainant, but was not confirmed. A thorough 321 intelligence report was completed and submitted to Narcotics. Narcotics units followed up immediately with a number of arrests of occupants of motor vehicles leaving that address. These arrests, being made at various locations throughout the command, led the complainant to believe that no police investigation or activity resulted from his complaints, and he continued to file complaints throughout other areas of the department. POP officers reached out to the complainant and explained that he most likely will not witness the arrests or see immediate results of the investigative work, which continues to produce results as an ongoing investigation. Intelligence was then shared with the COPE Unit, which worked with Narcotics regarding this address and several more arrests were made. Both units continue to update POP with their ongoing investigation, and their hard work and multiple arrests will eventually put an end to the narcotics activity at the location.
