DEADLY FACTS

Fentanyl, a powerful synthetic opioid, is increasingly being mixed with heroin, cocaine, Xanax, oxycodone, and other illicit drugs - often without the users' knowledge. Fentanyl related overdose deaths in Nassau County tripled from 22 to 67, from 2015 to 2016. In the first three months of 2017, at least 9 people in Nassau died from a mix of Fentanyl and cocaine. Last year, there were 190 opioid related deaths in Nassau County and about 330 in Suffolk County. That's an average of at least one Long Islander a day



How to Help Your Loved One After They've Overdosed

What to do Next TRI 11 x 8.5

WHEN A LOVED ONE OVERDOSES

Your loved one was just saved from a potentially fatal overdose - and is hopefully on the way to a hospital ER... **NOW WHAT?**

He or she could be discharged from the hospital in 2-3 hours, and may try to use the drug again to avoid painful withdrawal symptoms. Overdose can re-occur.

Naloxone (Narcan®) is the antidote to an opioid overdose. It can be kept at home and administered intra-nasally by non-medically trained civilians. **Always CALL 911 before administering Naloxone.**

Over-the-counter Naloxone can be purchased at CVS or Walgreens through health insurance coverage. Go to **www.health.ny.gov** to find nearby pharmacies that sell Naloxone.

NUMC

The Nassau University Medical Center (NUMC) Detox Unit helps people safely withdraw from alcohol, opiates and other addictive drugs - over 3-5 days. NUMC rehab offers long-acting Naltrexone for those who complete their 28 day program. For intake, call (516) 572-6394 or (516) 296-3256 from 7:00am-3:00pm, Sunday-Thursday. In case of emergency, go to the NUMC ER. For ambulatory detox, call CSEDNY Hempstead at (516) 481-0052, ext. 10, or Mercy Family Counseling in Garden City (516) 705-3400.

MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT

Nassau County's Opioid Treatment Program – at Building K, NUMC in East Meadow offers:

Methadone and Suboxone: Daily opiate-based medications that reduce cravings and unpleasant withdrawal symptoms by binding to opiate receptors in the brain. Call (516) 572-5801 or (516) 572-5906 between 7:00am-11:00am, Monday- Friday.

Long Acting Naltrexone (Vivitrol®): non-opiate medication given in monthly injection, blocks the opioid receptors in the brain for about 28 days. Go to **www.nassaucountyny.gov/shotatlife** for a list of Vivitrol providers.
