



FIRST PRECINCT POP SUCCESS STORY

The POP Unit received a complaint through the Town of Hempstead Councilwoman Erin King Sweeney's Office. The complaint was about parking issues in the vicinity of 2230 Howell St., Bellmore. That is the location of L.I. Baseball Inc., which is a business that conducts baseball instruction to youth baseball players. During the winter months, the indoor facility is very popular and lacks adequate parking, which creates parking congestion in the neighboring residential community.

POP responded to the location and observed the facility and the local area surrounding the facility. The facility is in a commercial area that adjoins a residential neighborhood. During the hours of operation, the local streets, which are narrow to begin with, become congested with vehicular traffic. Because of the inadequate parking at the facility, many of the parents who dropped off their children then proceeded to park in the nearby streets. Most available curbside parking is occupied with cars parking too close to corners and driveways.

The POP officers spoke to several of the neighbors. They mentioned how difficult it is to drive in the area at times of the business's operation. The residents stated they did not wish to have restricted parking signs added to the neighborhood. The neighbors were advised them to call 911 for any illegal parking conditions.

The business manager stated that they were aware of the problem. A flyer was suggested to hand out to customers about parking legally and respecting the neighbors. With the assistance of Councilwoman's Sweeney's Office, contact was made with both the Nassau County Fire Marshal's Office and the Town of Hempstead Building Department. Both agencies investigated the location. Summonses were issued by the Fire Marshal's Office and the Building Dept. is currently working with the business to permit additional onsite parking.

The post car was advised of the issue, and along with POP, has provided intensive patrol at the location and issued multiple warnings and parking summonses. Complaints in the area have decreased and with continued enforcement and the assistance of the outside agencies, the problem has subsided significantly.



SECOND PRECINCT POP (NORTH) SUCCESS STORY

POP Officer Matt McCartin, along with Inspector John Johnsen, met with the mayor and village trustees of Lattingtown. The trustees were concerned about excessive speeding throughout the school zone in front of the Locust Valley Middle/High School on Horse Hollow Road. They were looking for vehicle and traffic enforcement, along with possibly establishing a connection with the Nassau County Traffic Safety Engineering Department.

The POP Unit conducted an assessment of the road during school hours to observe traffic, review signage and come up with a feasible plan to resolve the issue. POP Officer McCartin had reached out to the school committee and requested an e-mail regarding the matter. Consequently, an aggressive vehicle and traffic blitz was conducted – several speeding summonses where issued over the course of a few months. A new laser gun was placed in the post car to assist with speed enforcement.

Additionally, POP Officer McCartin met with Nassau County Traffic Engineering to explain the problem and seek assistance. They agreed to conduct a traffic study on Horse Hollow Road and concluded that they will be implementing flashing, blinking speed devices that will operate during school hours. POP Officer McCartin had also requested that the engineering department explore the opportunity to put additional traffic lights along the road, review the timing of the lights and lower the speed limit in the zone.

As a result of the efforts of the POP Unit, the condition has improved and traffic engineering will be working directly with the Village of Lattingtown as it explores traffic safety on that road, along with getting the road repaved with proper markings and signage to ensure motorists comply with vehicle and traffic rules and regulations. The POP unit will follow-up to ensure the school zone remains safe during school hours.

SECOND PRECINCT POP (South) Success Story

The Second Precinct POP Unit was asked to join the Levittown Community Action Coalition (LCAC), which was created by the YES Community Counseling Center located on Center Lane in Levittown. The LCAC's mission is to create a safe, healthy and secure community for children and adults who have witnessed untimely deaths and whose lives have been greatly impacted by addiction through prevention, education and engagement with the community. The vision is for members of Levittown and the surrounding communities to respond to life's challenges without resorting to the use and abuse of alcohol, opiates or other drugs and to continue to support a community where people feel safe, valued, connected and empowered. POP has been working with local community leaders, politicians, school districts and parent advocates on this coalition. The NCPD developed a community mapping project that pinpoints areas of the precinct that are deemed good areas and bad areas for kids to hang out. This was done by bringing the maps to students who used red dots (bad) and green dots (good) to identify certain areas. This information is being utilized to assist the police department.

POP has most recently become a part of the youth and media committees. POP Officer Mike Cammarata is the liaison between the police department and the students of the local schools. He has met with a large number of students to discuss the use and availability of alcohol and tobacco within the precinct. POP Officer Dave Brohman has created and developed the LCAC's Facebook page in order to reach a larger population of the community.

With the above-mentioned information that has been gathered, POP will be conducting Project 21 and Project 19 investigations to curb underage sales of alcohol and tobacco. The POP Unit believes that being a part of this coalition has been a great success so far and they are looking forward to combating the alcohol and opiate crisis along with LCAC.

The progress of LCAC has spread into neighboring communities, and in the near future, the POP Unit will become part of the Farmingdale sector, as well.



THIRD PRECINCT (NORTH) POP Success Story

On 09/19/2017, POP Officers Hedgecock and Krukowski attended the Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Workshop for Law Enforcement –Train the Trainer Program, which was hosted and sponsored by DOH, the NYS Dept. of Highways and Engineers, NHTSA and the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee. After completing the program, officers approached the Village of Great Neck to institute this new enforcement initiative.

After several meetings between the village and their department of public works, six "Non-signalized" crossings were identified to upgrade to high-visibility crossings. These high-visibility crossings received numerous additional two-way crossing signage and pre-crossing signage to highlight the area. Of the six crossings updated, one was identified as the enforcement target area due to the hig- crossing volume and pedestrian cross-section during school hours. These crossings were found to be used by Great Neck High School-aged pedestrians to cross back and forth during their lunch periods from school in the vicinity of 540 Middle Neck Road, a mid-block crossing.

Pedestrian safety blitzes were conducted, which utilized a "Progressive Ticketing Method" – a three-stage process, based on Education, Warning and Ticketing. These blitzes were held on 9/28/2017, 10/26/2017, 11/29/2017 and 12/7/2017. A total of 33 written warnings and 45 summonses were issued.

On 11/15/2017, a meeting between the village attorneys, staff and POP Officers was conducted to review the pedestrian crossing Vehicle and Traffic Law (VTL) – (1151-A FAILED TO YLD RT-OF-WAY TO PEDESTRIAN/CROSSWALK).

Prosecution strategies, testimonies and official exhibits were discussed prior to any summons activity that was returned to the court.

The model of implementation for this enforcement initiative is now being discussed with several other villages who have requested to become involved because they have similar scenarios that need to be addressed.

THIRD PRECINCT (SOUTH) POP SUCCESS STORY

The Third Precinct POP Unit received a request for help from the East Williston Public Library to help improve security. Recently, there was an eye-opening incident that took place in the library – the safety and security of the library staff and its patrons was compromised. The incident took place during the day when a patron, for no logical reason, became very animated and irate while using the library's computer. The patron was then asked to leave the building but instead became more irate and proceeded behind the desk work area where the librarians work – and pushed a worker. The subject then exited the library, 911 was called, and a police report was filed.

The East Williston Public Library is situated directly across from the LIRR Train Station and is part of the Village Hall and adjoining firehouse. The library is very small, with one primary entrance and exit. The hours of the library are limited, and at most, there are two to three employees working at one time.

POP Officers Cooper and Atkin responded to the library and spoke directly with the employees to identify their security concerns, obtain further information about the subject, and review the current layout of the building. POP officers Cooper and Atkin then attended a meeting with the East Williston Public Library's Board of Directors. The officers listened to the concerns of the board regarding the safety and security of the library. The officers also made numerous recommendations to the board on how they can significantly improve security for the safety of their employees and the patrons. Officers also advised the board on how to legally inform someone that their library privileges have been revoked and that they will face the possibility of an arrest if they return, once informed.

A few weeks later, POP officers responded to the library with the post car. The librarian told officers that the individual who caused the original disturbance had returned. POP engaged with the subject and advised him that his library privileges had been revoked and that he is not to return or he will face being arrested. The subject left without incident. The library staff was very appreciative and thanked officers for their assistance

POP officers have been and will continue to check in with the library to assess their security status. The POP office has not received any further complaints. Since this incident, POP officers have made efforts to visit other libraries within the precinct to address their concerns and give lectures on safety and active shooter preparedness and survival techniques.

FOURTH PRECINCT POP SUCCESS STORY

The Fourth Precinct POP office was contacted by the Island Park Veterinarians Corporation in Island Park. They have had many problems with the neighboring businesses parking in front and behind the facility where parking is extremely tight. On January 30th, the Fourth Precinct POP team went to observe the problem and investigate the issue. While at the location, many cars were observed parking illegally. Some cars were parked while the driver ran in and out of a business within a few minutes, while other cars parked for significantly longer periods of time. Instead of just writing a few parking tickets to resolve the issue, POP decided to knock on some doors to find the owners and explain the situation. POP spoke to several owners, employees and some customers about the severe parking conditions. Everyone was very receptive and they all validated the severe parking issue. POP explained that the Unit would return at a later date to check on the situation.

Upon returning to the area on February 13th, the Fourth Precinct POP team did not observe any parking violations at all, and after speaking with the complainant, she was very happy and did not report any further issues since POP's prior visit. In addition, the location was brought to the attention of the post car, the precinct parking enforcement and the desk officer.



FIFTH PRECINCT POP SUCCESS STORY

The Fifth Precinct POP Office received several quality-of-life related complaints from the civic association leaders and residents about a local business located in West Hempstead (National Wholesale Liquidators). Supervisors at the Fifth received the complaints and notified the POP office. Residents were complaining that there were numerous tractor trailers parked illegally on Broad Street in violation of parking regulation signs that are posted.

POP identified the problems. An analysis of the area was conducted to determine the cause of the owners illegally parking their trailers. Broad Street is located in West Hempstead, which is adjacent to National Wholesale Liquidators. The tractor trailers were impeding the vision of motorists that utilize the parking lots on either side of Broad Street of National Wholesale Liquidators. The tractor trailers were making the area resemble a commercial parking lot.

The National Wholesale Liquidator has a large parking lot and attracts many shoppers from the area. Contact was made with the manager of the location and an inquiry was made to determine if the tractor trailers parked on Broad Street were there for that business. The manager stated that the trailers were not parked there to conduct business with the store. The store has tractor trailer parking bays where trucks can park legally.

The parked trailers were researched to determine what period of time certain trailers were parked there, and the history of the tractor trailers via the New York State Police Information Network (NYSPIN) was reviewed to locate the owners. In addition, POP officers conducted numerous visits and issued dozens of summonses for the parking violations. Post cars were also notified and they issued summonses as well. A PDCN Form 105 (Abandoned Vehicle Form) was prepared and forwarded to the Town of Hempstead. The town did not have a heavy tow truck capable of removing the tractor trailers so POP had to find another way to get the trailers removed. After researching the problem, POP found out that the county had a heavy-tow contract with 4A-1 Towing, located in Hicksville. After conferring with the Fifth Precinct Desk officers in regard to the chronic parking condition, the authority was given to impound the tractor trailers to 4A-1 Towing.

After one successful impound and numerous summonses issued, the volume of illegally parked trailers at this location declined significantly. POP continues to monitor the situation and enforcing laws pertaining to the tractor trailers via weekly visits and post car patrols.



SEVENTH PRECINCT POP SUCCESS STORY

Seventh Precinct POP Officers were contacted by a Massapequa resident who reported narcotics activity at a neighbors' house. Only an address was provided. POP officers were able to identify names associated with the address, and from there, did some investigative work to link several names and vehicles related to the residents producing possible narcotic networks.

POP was also in contact with the town to investigate any possible past issues at the location regarding ownership and if in fact the house was in foreclosure, which was reported by complainant, but was not confirmed.

A thorough Intelligence Report was completed and submitted to Narcotics Units, which followed up immediately with a number of arrests of the occupants of the motor vehicles leaving that address. These arrests, being made at various locations throughout the command, led the complainant to believe that no police investigation or activity resulted from his complaints, and he continued to file complaints throughout other areas of the department. POP officers reached out to the complainant and explained that he most likely will not witness the arrests or see immediate results of the investigative work, which continues to produce results as an ongoing investigation.

Intelligence was then shared with the COPE Unit. COPE worked with Narcotics and several more arrests were made. Both units continue to update POP with their ongoing investigation and progress, which has significantly lessened the activity there, and will ultimately put an end to narcotics activity at this location.
