REQUIREMENTS

- Candidates must compete in the required written examination and pass other screening procedures, including background investigation
- Candidates must be at least 17 years of age and have not reached their 35th birthday on the day of written exam; however, time spent on military duty or on terminal leave, not exceeding a total of seven years, shall be subtracted from the age of any applicant who passed their 35th birth day as provided in subdivision 10-a of Section 243 of the New York State Military Law
- No college education is required to take the examination, however, one year (32 credits) of college education is required for appointment. Those candidates who have not attained that level of education but are otherwise eligible for appointment will remain on the eligible list and will become eligible for appointment after they have obtained the necessary college credits
- Please note: Some village police departments require only a high school diploma for appointment

- Candidates must meet the physical and medical standards that apply at the time of the test
- Candidates must be able to perform the essential functions of the job
- Candidates must hold a valid New York State Drivers License at time of appointment
- Candidates must be legal residents of Nassau County, Suffolk County, Westchester County or one of the five boroughs of New York City at time of appointment and maintain residence within these areas
- Candidates must be citizens of the United States and Supervisory promotions are based upon the results of promotional examinations
- Appointments are determined on an individual basis by the Nassau County Civil Service Commission.

OPPORTUNITIES

With experience comes opportunity for career advancement and promotion to supervisory ranks. Supervisory promotions are based upon the results of promotional examinations. Career opportunities include: patrol, marine, aviation, mounted, canine, plainclothes, specialized enforcement and many others. There is also the detective division which conducts investigations through a number of different squads such as: precinct, homicide, robbery, arson/bomb, property, juvenile and sex crimes. Additional opportunities are available in highway patrol, emergency services and community affairs along with a number of other units that reflect the needs of any large employer.
